Annabelle Rose is a fun, carefree garden space designed for an Auburn family happy to be returning to their college home. Beautiful stonework is used throughout the landscape design to tie the home and garden areas together. Note the driveway inset, the curved sidewalk and the patio facing the lake.

The Auburn influence begins at the entry with a Japanese maple tree purchased from Coach Pat Dye's nursery. The live oak in the backyard was grown from one of the original Toomer's Oaks. Blue and orange garden accessories can be seen throughout the garden.

The backyard was planned for entertaining and relaxing. Banana shrubs were planted near the back porch for their great fragrance. Limelight hydrangeas and gardenias soften the seating area near the fire pit, which features a custom designed copper cover.
