

Garden's Landscape: Views & Paths

Link to larger landscape

Link to Natural World

Mood created

Feelings it Evokes - Transitions:

Pause & focus – rest

Stroll & move

- Draws you to beautiful water features lake


Intrigue Garden – White Oaks

Architectural Elements

- Use of Gates, Doorways, Stones, Walls, Hedges.
- Type of paths used to connect sections of garden.
- Pergolas, Gazebos, Arbors,
 Statues, Trellises, Fountains






STRUCTURES & ARCHITECTURE

- Enter Centuries old White Oak.
- Look for public courtyard focal points.
- Framing views of garden: thunder house & reflective pool.
- Yashino cherry trees border Auburn University President's House





STRUCTURES & ARCHITECTURE: Pergolas

Hidden Oasis – Potomac Court, Auburn

- Look for garden focal points - Mood
- Framing of Garden Views
- Intimate spaces swings, benches
- Encore azaleas, camelias, Knockout roses

ALABAMA AAN & AUBURN UNIVERSITIES

ARBORS & WOODEN SWING

- Look for garden focal points
- Arbor covered with clematis
- Wooden swing enveloped in wisteria
- Framing of garden views with calming plants
- Stone floor mondo grass





Serendipitous Garden - Auburn

Plants Combine into a distinctive whole

- Plant choice based on patterns of sun and shade
- How they create a restful mood
- Used to frame garden views
- Back patio stacked stones
- Wildlife Habitat

- How do plants combine to create a distinctive whole - mood?
- How does the pattern of shade or sunlight affect the garden and the plant choices?
- How do different textures and heights compliment each other?

- Choose & use special features that evoke a special response in you.








